The incredible life of Don Diego Stuno de la Vega

Also known as El Stuno or Don Stuno de Las Vegas, Don Diego Stuno de la Vega is an historical figure of California. Born on 7th February 1855 in Los Angeles, California, at the <u>Stuno Motion Picture Corporation</u> studios, El Stuno saved California from the dangerous dictator Rafael Nadal, an envoy and secret spy of the King of Spain, Alphonso El Marriachi.

El Stuno became famous first as a professional surfer at Malibu Beach. He soon after embraced a Jazz singer career and together with his friend Pablo Picasso, formed the band 'The Beatles on the rocks'.

Don Diego Stuno de la Vega is also known for being the first man to set foot on the planet Mars on 7th February 1955 as the Lead Astronaut and Chief Executive Officer of the unmanned mission Athena 18.
